Malala Yousafzai is a Pakistani activist for female education and the youngest-ever *Nobel Prize* laureate. On 10 October 2014, Yousafzai was announced as the co-recipient of the 2014 *Nobel Peace Prize* for her **struggle** <u>against</u> the suppression of children and young people and for the **right** of all children to education. Having received the prize at the age of 17, Yousafzai is the youngest Nobel laureate. Yousafzai shared the prize with Kailash Satyarthi, a children's rights activist from India.

On 9 October 2012, a Taliban <u>gunman</u> shot Yousafzai as she rode home on a bus after taking an exam in Pakistan's Swat Valley. The <u>masked</u> gunman shouted "Which one of you is Malala? Speak up, otherwise, I will **shoot** you all", and, on her being identified, shot at her. She was hit with one **bullet**, which went through her head, neck, and ended on her shoulder. Two other girls were also <u>wounded</u> in the shooting: Kainat Riaz and Shazia Ramzan, both were stable enough to speak to reporters and provide details of the attack.

On 12 July 2015, her 18th birthday, Yousafzai opened a school in the Bekaa Valley, Lebanon, near the Syrian <u>border</u>, for Syrian refugees. The school, **funded** by the <u>not-for-profit</u> Malala Fund, offers education and training to girls aged 14 to 18 years. Yousafzai called on world leaders to **invest** in "books, not bullets".
